Children with disabilities often miss out on the customary "traditions of childhood" like taking their picture with Santa Claus, going on an Easter Egg Hunt, Trick or Treating, and other childhood activities that we all grew up participating in and took for granted. Often, these events held in the community for children are not inclusive or accessible for children with disabilities and their families. Missing out on these opportunities leads to further developmental challenges as well as social isolation.

Through the Traditions of Childhood Series, The M.O.R.G.A.N. Project partners with community organizations to provide opportunities for families of children with disabilities of all ages to make treasured memories and improve their quality of life. Organizations submit an application outlining their event and detailed budget for consideration, and once selected as a partner and having the event approved, The M.O.R.G.A.N. Project covers the costs for the event.
